

Polish education in the former Pomerania Province in the Second Polish Republic

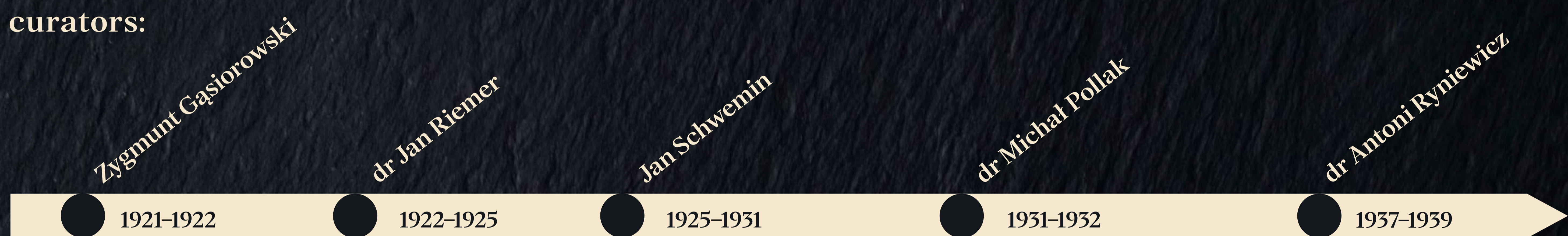
By decision of the authorities of the reborn Republic of Poland, and on the basis of the provisions of the Act of 1 August 1919, the Pomerania Province was created from parts of the former Prussian partition (West Prussia). However, it was not until January 1920, after the entry of the Polish Army, that the organization of new state institutions could begin.

By decree of the Minister of Religious Affairs and Public Education, the Pomeranian School District was established. As throughout the country, it was divided into smaller organizational units, or sub-districts. The scope and organization of the district were subject to further changes in the following years. The last one before the outbreak of World War II took place in 1938.

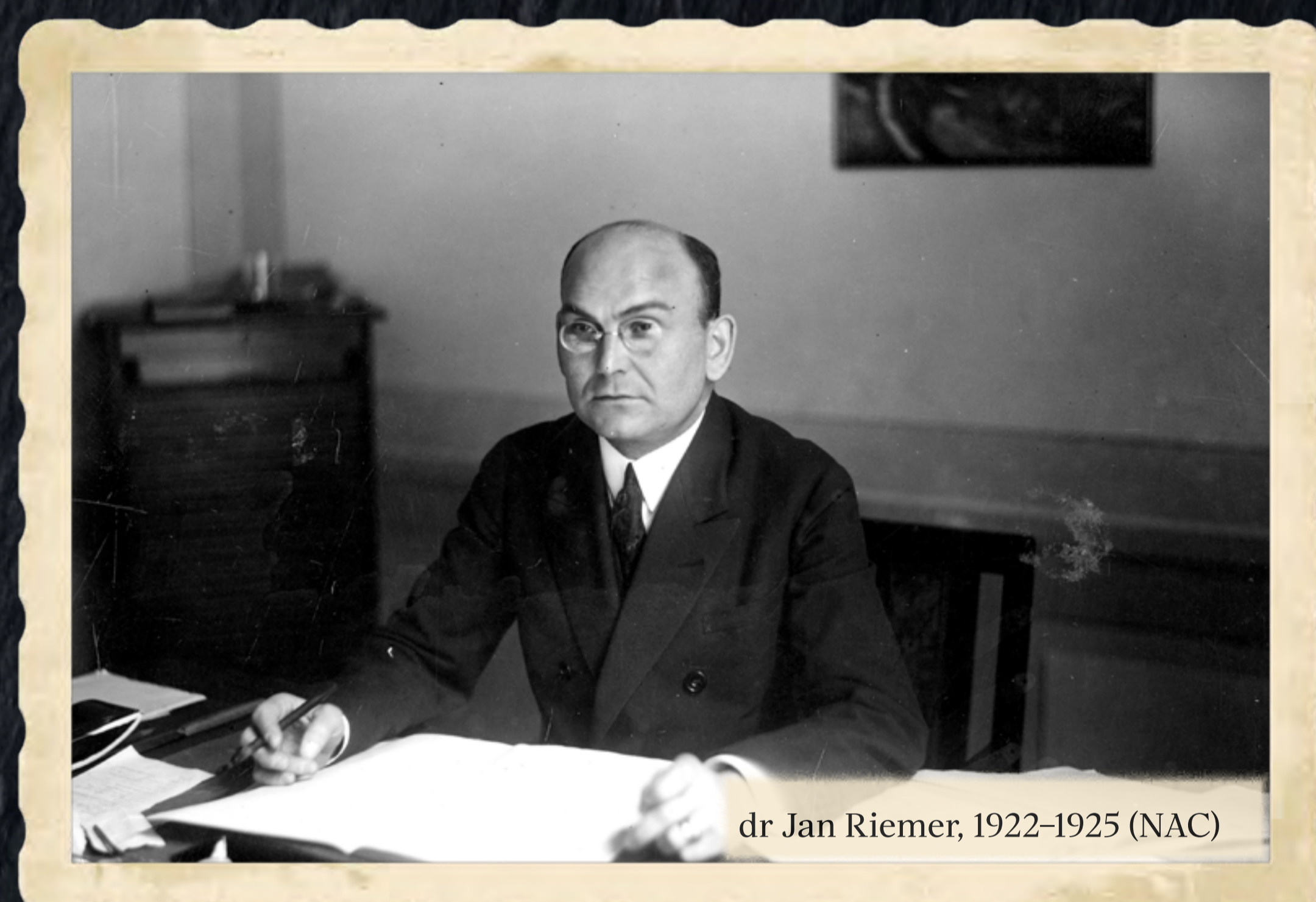

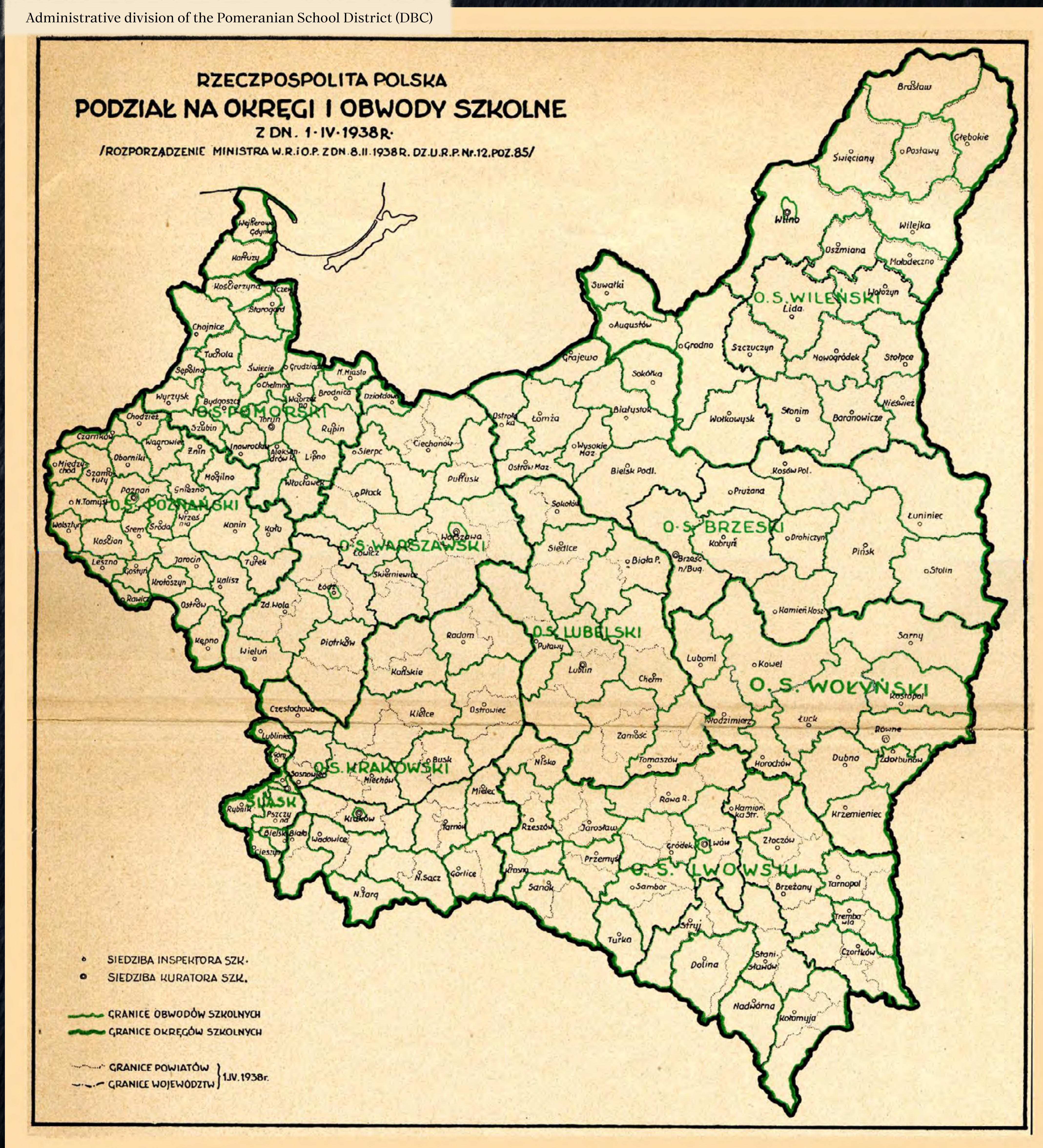


dr Jan Riemer, 1922-1925 (NAC)
